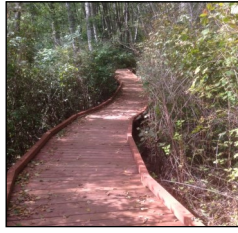

605 documented volunteer visits.

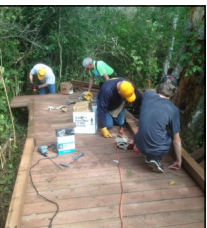
2042 volunteer hours recorded.

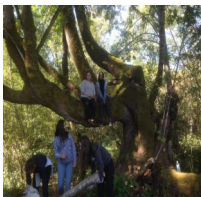
The Poulsbo Fish Park Steering Committee met 12 times to budget, strategize, and plan activities and events.
