2.	Kitsap County CIP Update	AK presented and highlighted Kitsap County CIP. Brought attention to projects which have City involvement at some level. Minor adjustments primarily cost adjustments. County sewer project moved out one year in 6year CIP. City agreement with County says that City pays one year after completion of project. No big surprises in this CIP update. DL discussed how County has been good to work with on CIPP project. Today County has problem with centerfuge. Broke and they are not accepting septic trucks and are currently hauling sludge away. If problem persists County could be looking at equipment costing \$30,000 per month. City is charged a percentage of operating costs.				
3.	Neighborhood Speeding Project Update	AK updated about the neighborhood speed program. Got \$10,000 per year, this year spent \$7,000 on radar speed signs. Going into next year we will have \$13,000 and focus on project on Lemolo. Developer has to install a small public park adjacent to waterfront trail. Would like island on road to provide crossing, mark entry to Poulsbo city limits, slow down traffic, and provide water quality treatment.				
4.	Pavement Maintenance Demo Project Acceptance	ML presented Chip seal project for final acceptance. Overall outreach made successful project. Will see how the chip seal lasts over the winter. Few people have grumbles but the general feedback is positive. The fog seal over the top is critical to providing good product.				
5.	Arco Project Night Work Request	CR presented Arco project night request. PWC recommended approval to council. Will be on agenda Nov. 15 th . Work will

6.	Solid Waste Summary Discussion	require shutoff effecting Sonic restaurant. Must be done at night. AK provided summary of solid waste workshop. Council workshop is on November 15 th meeting. Summary proposed changes to rates. Goal is to get rates closer to industry standards. Focus of council meeting is to provide the summary of conclusions. ML talked about recycle industry and China recent decision to not accept recycling unless very clean. Bainbridge Recycling contract rate for recycle is going to increase. Bainbridge Recycling current rate is \$3.00 could go up to as high as \$6.00. Solid waste does not reflect recent recycling rate increase.			
7.	Noll Road Project Update	DL presented update to Noll road project. Some right of way acquisitions offered. Anticipate 60% design and Final PS&E. Executive session in December.			
8.	Contract with Gardiner Bay	ML discussed additional work required in the Gardiner bay solid waste plan. About \$11,000 addition to contract to cover the additional work required. Total will be \$29,000 contract. Will be on consent agenda at next council meeting. Mayor has signing authority, money is coming out of Solid Waste budget. PWC recommends approval and good with consent agenda.
