2019 Lodging Tax Grant Projects

The City of Poulsbo is now accepting grant applications for 2019 Lodging Tax Grant Projects as set forth in RCW 67.28. Projects must be based in Poulsbo and related to Tourism, Tourism Promotions, Event Operations or a Tourism-related facility. These funds are charges collected for the furnishing of lodging within the Poulsbo city limits, including rooms in hotels, motels, rooming houses, private campgrounds, RV parks and similar facilities. Application packets are due to Poulsbo City Hall by 4:00 pm on Wednesday, August 1, 2018.

Harrison Force Main/Fjord Drive Utility Project

The City of Poulsbo will be constructing improvements to the Fjord Drive/Harrison Street Sewer/Water/Storm System. The water main will be replaced and upsized - adding more capacity and improving fire flow. The sanitary sewer system will be upgraded and moved from its current shoreline location and rerouted down Fjord Drive up to Harrison. The storm sewer system will also receive minor upgrades - improving drainage. Additionally, Cascade Natural Gas has begun installing new gas lines. All utilities are aging and due for upgrades. The driving lanes will be replaced on Fjord Drive and on the west side of Hostmark Street within the project limits and there will be ADA upgrades on Hostmark Street.

Bids opened on May 30, 2018 at 2:00pm at City Hall. Seton Construction was the lowest responsive bidder in the amount of \$740,279.26 Construction is expected to begin late July and to wrap up by Mid-Late September 2018.

advisory committee, in a series of five workshops March through April 2018. The Poulsbo City Council began their review in May, and have held three workshops on the changes, with a public hearing on June 20, 2018. The Council is currently in deliberations.

Some of changes recommended by the Planning Commission are:

- Lowering the existing allowable building height from 45' to 35' in the C-1 downtown zoning district and decreasing the lot coverage standard for larger lots from 100% to 85%.
- Enhanced building design standards in the C-1 downtown zoning district to ensure continuation of the Scandinavian heritage and small village character.
- A new overlay to preserve the historical development pattern along Front Street.
- Additional building design, landscaping and screening standards for the other commercial districts outside of the downtown.
- Residential units through mixed use development, in the downtown and other commercial areas, to increase housing options.

The City Council will continue their deliberations at their July 11, 2018 meeting, and are considering the appropriate height for downtown and how to incorporate residential units into the downtown in a way that retains its unique character and heritage. These are meaningful and important considerations as the City continues to strike a balance of folding more people into Poulsbo in a way that builds upon the identity of the city.
