WHEREAS, in Nebraska in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed that a special day be set aside

for the planting of trees and, for the first Arbor Day, more than a million trees

were planted in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, trees touch the lives of people within the community who benefit daily from

cleaner air, shadier streets, and aesthetic beauty that healthy, well-managed

urban forests provide; and

WHEREAS, Trees can make a strong contribution to a community's pride; and

WHEREAS, the city established the Poulsbo Tree Board in March 1997 and for the 19th year

in a row, Poulsbo has been designated a Tree City USA by the National Arbor

Day Foundation for its ongoing urban forestry commitment;

WHEREAS. The Poulsbo Tree Board will be planting a Sourwood tree at Centennial Park,

and training those in attendance about proper tree planting techniques and care;

a map of existing trees at the park will also be available.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rebecca Erickson, Mayor of the City of Poulsbo, Washington, do hereby proclaim April 16, 2016:

ARBOR DAY

in the City of Poulsbo and encourage our citizens to celebrate Arbor Day, and enjoy the beauty of our community. Further, I urge all citizens to plant trees to gladden the heart and promote the well-being of this and future generations.
