


Forest Rock Lane Pavement Project

Our first construction project of 2019 is expected to begin May 23rd and wrap up near the end of July. This project will rebuild the road base, install trench drains, and thicken asphalt to improve the road. The road will be upgraded from the Central Market entrance to Caldart Avenue.



This is the first Full Depth Reclamation type of project for the City. The existing road and base is pulverized and used to build the new road section on top of it. This means the project reuses material, reduces the work and material required by the contractor, and shortens the duration of the project. The



project will also include drainage enhancements, ADA upgrades, installation of a radar speed sign, and channelization of the road to reduce speed.



During construction a portion of Forest Rock Lane will be closed for the duration of the project. The portion of the closed road does not have any driveways on it; however, there will be no access during construction.

- Finn Hill Shared Use Path: As part of our transportation plan, the City is looking to enhance pedestrian and bicycle safety. We are teaming up with Kitsap County to create a safer shared use path along Finn Hill towards Vinland Elementary. Designs have begun and we are hoping to advertise for construction in late spring to early summer 2019.
- SR305, Raab Park, and 11th Ave Manhole Project: In conjunction with our previous sewer rehab projects, this one will reline and replace our current sewer pipes on parts of SR305, 11th Ave, and through Raab Park (summer 2019)

Poulsbo Pump Track Update



West Sound Chapter Representative, recently submitted the Poulsbo Pump Track's 2018 annual report. While they've dealt with a bit of vandalism over the past year, volunteers and the Poulsbo Police Department have handled those issues. According to the report, "Regularly there are half a dozen users at the park, usually after work hours or on weekends...The past year we redesigned and rebuilt a portion of the track with all volunteer labor. There continues to be a core group of volunteers who continue to work at the track as needed...This year we improved the bio retention bond to prevent run off on the neighboring property. We also improved the drains to improve drainage after heavy rains. We will continue to monitor drainage issues at the park after heavy rains." Their biggest success was "Pumpapalooza: On 10 September 2018...[we] held the 'Pumpapalooza.' This free event had over 50 children in attendance. The participants' bikes we safety checked and minor repairs were completed as required. EMBA instructors were on hand to reach these young riders basic riding techniques to include cornering and pumping, which are vital to safe and enjoyable trail riding."
