Poulsbo Municipal Court is changing collection agencies effective August 29, 2019. The new agency will be Dynamic Collectors from Chehalis, WA. As a result of this change the Poulsbo Municipal Court will be offering a 30-day amnesty period for court fines. This is a limited time offer. Personal checks will not be accepted, only cash, money order/cashier's check or a credit card payment.

Poulsbo Mayor Becky Erickson expressed her support for this new opportunity for people to regain their driver's license and become valid drivers again.



Census 2020 - Address Canvassing has Begun

The first major field operation of the 2020 Census, Address Canvasing, known as AdCan, began August 4th and ends October 18th. Temporary staff, known as Listers, have been hired to help. Their job is to make sure the 2020 Census address lists are accurate and complete. Listers will canvass about 30% of the county, knocking on every door of communities they are canvassing to conduct quality checks and collect responses for ongoing surveys. Listers can be identified by their badges, bags, and laptops with the "Census 2020" logos on them. Park Improvements - Fall 2019

The City of Poulsbo will be making some needed park improvements thanks to the typically dry fall weather. Beginning September 9th, Muriel Iverson Williams Waterfront Park will be getting new sidewalks on the north side of the Austin-Kvelstad Pavilion. Some of the large hedges will also be removed in order to open up the area. Public Works staff has been busy finishing up summer projects and preparing for the fall projects.

Austurbruin Park will be getting a play structure replacement in mid-September. The current structure is about 20 years old and has lived a long, useful life. The new toy will include a Spin Max Orbit and Custom balance pads. Lions Park will see a replacement of the merry-go-round, the most loved piece of play equipment in the city!

Department of Natural Resources Grant

The City of Poulsbo has received a grant from the



Washington Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Urban and Community Forestry Program to expand the arboretum at Centennial Park. This city park is located at the corner of 7th Avenue NE and Iverson Street. The goal of the project is to showcase a tree planting demonstration project that will enhance the public's understanding of the benefits of establishing and maintaining trees. These trees will add diversity to an urban park setting that will offset a landscape that includes buildings, streets, sidewalks and a salmonbearing creek in the city. It will also aid the Poulsbo citizenry on tree selection and diversity in their own yards, and educate other on how to plan trees and what tree species do well in the area.

Planning is underway, and the tree planting events will be led by the Poulsbo Tree Board using community organizations and volunteers in November 2019. A self-guided tour brochure will be available after the plantings are completed.

Funds for this project were provided by the USDA Forest Service Urban and Community Forestry Program, administered through the State of Washington Department of Natural Resources Urban and Community Forestry Program.

Peninsula Regional Transportation Planning Organization Draft 2040 Plan

The Peninsula Regional Transportation Planning Organization (PRTPO) invites the public to review and comment on their draft 2040 Regional Transportation Plan. According to the PRTPO, "This long-range policy plan establishes a vision, goals and policies for the four-county Peninsula region. This update of the 2035 plan extends the planning horizon to 2040, refreshes goals and policies, and offers a range of regional strategies to maintain and improve the region's transportation system." The comment period is from September 3rd to October 18th, and there are a series of four open houses around the region that the public are encouraged to attend.
