Help keep storm drains clear!

Clogged storm drains can cause local flooding of roads and private property. City crews work to keep storm drains clear, but with over 2500 drains in Poulsbo, we can't be everywhere at once! With your help, we can keep streets safe, storm drains clear, and reduce flooding and property damage in your neighborhood.

How can I help?

CLOGGED STORM DRAINS

- Keep neighborhood storm drains free of leaves and debris.
 If you see a clogged storm drain, use a rake, shovel handle, or stick to clear the drain. If this does not help, report the blockage with the City's <u>SeeClickFix app. on-line</u>, by phone.
- or email.
 STAY SAFEI Only clear a drain if you can do it safely..... and NEVER remove a storm drain lid or attempt to clean a drain located in a busy street.
- Do not wade into water when you are unsure of the depth.

LEAF DISPOSAL

- Do not blow or sweep leaves into the road, ditches, or storm drains. (Street sweepers cannot pick up piles of leaves.)
- Dispose of leaves in your yard waste container, compost bin, or by taking them to a local composting facility. If you use a landscaping company, ask them to take the leaves with them.

CHECK YOUR GUTTERS AND DOWNSPOUTS

- Clear gutters and downspouts of leaves and debris.
- Replace leaky or broken gutters.
 Make sure downspouts are directed away from your house.



The City performs regular maintenance of the stormwater system throughout the year. During the rainy season, crews are especially watchful and work hard to minimize local flooding. Citizens can help by maintaining their property in a way to minimize the effects of leaves and debris on the stormwater system.

Clogged storm drains can lead to flooding of streets and homes!



What is a storm drain? Storm drains are rectangular grates

with slats and are normally near the edge of the street. These grates collect water which then flows to the nearest stream or waterway
