## Finn Hill Shared Use Path Project

The City of Poulsbo will be constructing approximately 4,300 feet of a 10-ft wide shared use path with 2-ft gravel shoulders on NW Finn Hill Road and Rhododendron Lane NW between Olhava Way NW and Vinland Elementary School in Poulsbo. The path will be asphalt with permeable ballast. The path will be on the north side of Finn Hill Road and the east side of Rhododendron Lane. An approximate 400-ft section of path will be constructed as elevated 8-ft wide boardwalk to avoid wetland impacts. Curb ramps, pedestrian crossing signs, and cross walk markings will be installed at the intersections of NW Finn Hill/Urdaahl Road and NW Finn Hill Road/NW Rude Road. Approximately 4,200 feet of new curb, gutter, and storm drainage pipe will be installed between the travel lane and the landscape buffer/boardwalk/multi-use path on the north side of NW Finn Hill Road and the east side of NW Rhododendron Lane.



Bid open is on February 10th at 10:00 a.m. at City Hall. Construction is expected to begin late spring and wrap up late August 2020. The estimated construction cost is \$1.85M - \$2.05M.

## Liberty Bay Bioretention Project

The City of Poulsbo will be constructing and installing water quality features at three locations within the city:

- School District Campus (Treatment Vault) - treats 2.56 acres of Pollution Generating Impervious Surfaces (PGIS)
- Fjord near Poulsbo Yacht Club (Bioretention Swale) - treats 0.46 acres of PGIS
- Front Street near Jensen intersection (Treatment Vault) - treats 0.113 acres of PGIS

Bid open is on February 11th at 10:00 a.m. at City Hall. Construction is expected to begin this spring and wrap up May 2020. The estimated construction cost is \$310,000 - \$370,000.
