Centennial Park

Centennial Park was dedicated in 2008 in celebration of the city's first 100 years. In 2018, community volunteers and organizations including Western Washington University Huxley College of the Environment spent many hours improving the site by building soft surface trails, restoring riparian habitat along 400' of Dogfish Creek, and creating new interpretive signage. This park is the site of a former nursery, so many unique and beautiful trees were already flourishing in the park. With the help of the WA State Dept of Natural Resources Urban and Community Forestry Program, the Poulsbo Tree Board worked with others to enhance the Centennial Park Arboretum in 2020 with the planting of an additional 17 trees and tree identification signage.

We invite you to enjoy the walk, and hope that your appreciation of trees in the community will be enhanced. The value of trees is endless, and everyone profits from the beauty and benefits that they bring.
