Consumor su Consum	Councilmember Lord moved that the Committee supports a drive-up flu vaccine service at City Hall on October 16 hosted by RiteAid Pharmacy. This support is conditioned on City legal approval. The Committee recommends to Council the use of City CARES dollars of up to \$1,000 for this purpose or, if hat use is deemed inappropriate, City funds of up to \$1,000. Approved unanimously. Cim reported that meal service at Gateway has started up again: meals being served Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Kim will coordinate volunteers if more are needed.

В	Discussion of Budget Request, 2021 Housing, Health, and Human Services Department	Kim discussed the two new budget requests for a H3 department and a .5 police navigator program under the umbrella of H3. There may be 70k from the 2020 Behavioral Health program to apply to navigator (50k) and H3 (20k). Council being asked to commit appx 30k in new funds for both programs.
		Councilmember Lord asked for clarification on Kim's consulting fees and Treatment Tax funding for a possible Fire CARES program. Notifications of County grant decisions will be given in late October.
		The Committee recommends the two new program requests, as presented, for establishing a Housing, Health and Human Services Department and the of the Police Navigator Program. The Committee recommends that both requests by

С	Council Resolution Allocating City Property for Affordable Housing Purposes	Kim discussed the Resolution under consideration this evening and Mayor Erickson discussed some of the history of the two City parcels (Triangle, Klingle) and why they are both difficult to develop. The City, under the proposed resolution, will retain ownership of both properties and reserve its use for affordable/deeply affordable housing. Kim mentioned possible opposition from other Councilmembers who may want to sell the land for revenue. Committee members expressed strong preference using land for developing affordable housing—this step does not guarantee new units will be built, but helps us explore options. Councilmember Musgrove and Lord recommended that language of resolution be strengthened to attract development; current version too open ended. The Committee recommends that the Affordable Housing Resolution be adopted as presented with the final language of the document changed: "The restriction of use at both properties will exist until it is undone or strengthened by an affirmative act of City Council." The next step after the Resolution is passed will be to do feasibility studies; determine what kind of

		Councilmember Lord asked Karla if ADU code could be changed to allow non-owner occupancy at the Triangle and not in other parts of Poulsbo. Karla will discuss at the October 7 meeting (but an exception to a standard is possible.)
