1. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Erickson called the meeting to order in the Council Chambers at 7:00 PM and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. CLOSED SESSION

At 7:02 PM Mayor Erickson recessed the meeting for a Closed Session to discuss Union Negotiations pursuant to RCW 42.30140(4).

Mayor Erickson reconvened the meeting at 7:48 PM.

3. MAYOR'S REPORT AND AGENDA REVIEW

- a. <u>City Hall Update</u>: Mayor Erickson announced the Grand Opening is scheduled for November 17th.
- Introduction of Police Volunteer: Police Chief Swiney introduced new Police Volunteer Jim Norman.
- c. <u>Commendation of Jay Gillen and K-9 Aico</u>: Police Chief Swiney presented Police Officer Gillen and K-9 Officer Aico with a commendation.

4. COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS

- a. John Lee commented on the misinformation published in the North Kitsap Herald regarding the Viking Avenue Improvements Phase 3B, and the funding sources for the project.
- b. Denise Bauman commented the Marine Science Center will be holding a public fundraiser on Saturday, October 23rd.

5. COUNCIL DISCUSSION/COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

a. <u>Public/Safety Legal Committee</u>: Councilmember Henry reported on the recommendation to approve the agreement with the City of Forks; the Police Department received a Ballistic Vest grant; Police Clerk Amanda Dixon has returned to work after her car accident; and the Municipal Court is now closed for during lunch hours.

Councilmember Stern reported there is a decrease in ticket revenue by 40% this year. Mayor Erickson stated the decreased traffic stops and ticketing is a policy decision and can be reviewed by the Council.

Councilmember Rudolph expressed concern with the amount of traffic stops not decreasing, however the ticket revenue is decreasing.

- b. Councilmember Stern reported on the Poulsbo Chamber of Commerce's membership drive focus and encouraged businesses and individuals not currently members, to think about joining the Chamber.
- c. Councilmember Berry-Maraist commented on the success of the first Poulsbo Marathon and the involvement of local students.

a. Ordinance No. 2010-21, FEMA Floodplain Management

Associate Engineer Bateman reported the FEMA update includes updated maps and correction to errors.

b. Ordinance No. 2010-22, 3rd Quarter Budget Amendments

a. Tom Foley questioned whether the Police Department received the color copier requested; Finance Director Booher stated the copier was approved and purchased.
