Project Description: The amendments to t

The amendments to the Poulsbo Municipal Code (PMC) are presented in 3 categories – Housekeeping, State Mandates, and Housing Diversity.

- Housekeeping amendments are part of the PED Departments on-going effort to make land
 use regulations more usable for residents, developers, and City staff by correcting errors,
 eliminating text ambiguities, codifying internal policies, and reflecting changes in state law.
 The proposed amendments do not involve significant changes to the code.
- State mandates refer to directives or requirements imposed by the state government on local jurisdictions or municipalities regarding how they plan and regulate land use within their boundaries.
- Housing diversity refers to the variety of housing options available and encompasses a
 range of housing types, sizes, styles, and price points to accommodate the diverse needs
 and preferences within the community.

Review Process: hearing on Janua

The Poulsbo Planning Commission reviewed the 2024 Land Use Code Amendments in a public hearing on January 23, 2024, and recommended approval to the City Council. The City Council reviewed the approved amendments at a duly advertised public hearing on March 6, 2024.

Decision:

The City Council has APPROVED the 2024 Land Use Code Amendments. This decision is represented in Ordinance 2024-05.

Appeal Authority:

Per RCW 36.70A.290, appeals of development regulations are to be made with the Growth Management Hearings Board by **Monday, May 13, 2024**, per their prescribed requirements and procedures in RCW 36.70A.290.
