

What are Capital Facilities?


Infrastructure needed to adequately serve the City residents and businesses:

- Water
- Sanitary Sewer
- Stormwater Management
- Transportation streets and non-motorized
- Parks
- Government Buildings
- Solid Waste
- Schools
- Fire Protection
- Library

GMA's consideration is for new capacity; City's(and others') budget consideration is for all facilities.

How does Poulsbo meet the GMA Capital Facilities requirement?

A Capital Facilities Plan is required by GMA (RCW 36.70A.070(3)). Poulsbo's Capital Facilities approach is:



Functional Plans

Functional Plans are the method the City meets GMA requirements for the primary City operated infrastructure and facilities. Adopted as appendices to the comprehensive plan are:

Water

Stormwater Management

Transportation

• Transportation Plan Update 2016

Parks

- Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan 2021

Part 2 Capital Facilities Plan Components

Comprehensive Plan Part 2 – Capital Facilities Plan

- Summarizes the City's functional plans
- Includes other facilities, not the subject of a functional plan, such as:
 - Police Protection
 - Solid Waste
 - Government Buildings
 - Fire and Emergency Services (Poulsbo Fire District)
 - Schools (North Kitsap School District)
 - Library (Kitsap Regional Library)

Part 2 Capital Facilities Plan Components

Comprehensive Plan Part 2 – Capital Facilities Plan

- Inventory
 - References Functional Plan section
 - For non-functional plan, identifies
- Adopted Level of Service Standard
- Evaluation of Future Facility Needs
 - Existing Facilities compared to future growth through LOS standard
- 20-year Capital Facility List Developed
- 6-year CIP Budget Prioritization
- Funding Evaluation and Identification

Functional Plans

Functional Plans serve for other state agency requirements for infrastructure planning:

Water

Washington State Department of Health

Sanitary Sewer

 Washington State Department of Ecology

Stormwater Management

 While not specifically required, is related to and must be coordinated with NPDES and other DOE planning requirements

Transportation

- Required by GMA only
- WSDOT requires Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP)

Parks

 Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office

Transportation

Transportation has additional requirements under RCW 36.70A.070(6), which must include:

- Land Use assumptions used for estimating travel demand
- Inventory of air, water and ground transportation facilities
- Level of Service standards for all locally and state transportation facilities
- Forecasts of traffic based on land use and growth projections
- Requirements for bringing transportation facilities that fall below LOS based upon forecast
- Financing analysis 20 year and 6 year
- Demand Management Strategies
- Pedestrian and Bicycle component

- Has substantial capital improvement projects needed
- Charlie Roberts lead

Stormwater Management

- Will be last functional plan to be updated
- Begin 2nd half of 2023
- Anticipated to be in-house effort
- Charlie Roberts lead

Transportation

- Budget allocated
- Finalizing Contract with Parametrix
- NTP by mid-March
- Josh Ranes lead

Parks

- Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan 2021
- Urban Paths of Poulsbo 2018
- Minor updates to each
- Nikole Coleman lead w/coordination with Parks Director
