CITY OF POULSBO AUTOMATED RED-LIGHT CAMERA SAFETY PROGRAM BEGINS ISSUING CITATIONS AT SR 305 AT BOND RD AND SR 307

30-Day Warning Period Ends

Poulsbo, WA – October 27, 2025 – The City of Poulsbo announces its new Red-Light Traffic Safety Program is operational and will begin issuing citations starting October 30th for anyone running a red light.

One camera has been installed at the intersection of SR 305 at Bond Rd and SR 307. Warnings began on September 30, and all violators will now incur fines starting on October 30. Fines are \$145 and will be sent to the vehicle's registered owner. Violations include failing to stop when the light has already turned red and failing to come to a complete stop before turning right on red.

The new red-light camera is one of many tools Poulsbo employs to keep the community safe. The city successfully launched one park zone camera in the fall of 2024 and one school zone camera earlier this year.

The City of Poulsbo contracted with Verra Mobility, a leader in speed safety technology, to administer this safety program. The cameras will capture images of vehicle license plates and send them through secure video. Law enforcement will verify the infraction before a fine is issued.

"We want the public to know how seriously we take this growing issue", said Police Chief Ron Harding. "This is not about generating revenue; this is about the safety of our community. Please remember to slow down and always stop on red."
